

Year 5 Homework Summer Term 2024

This overview gives you some ideas of how to keep on learning at home. Mrs Valli and Miss Hussain have set each of you some challenges to complete for all of the subjects that we will be looking at in class, or some of the challenges may revisit prior learning.

Don't forget:

- ♦ A lot of your homework challenges will be revisiting 'sticky' knowledge' from topics you have learnt in class. Sticky Knowledge Organisers are available on the school website.
- ♦ Try to complete at least one piece of home learning a week, and bring in your homework book to be marked.
- ♦ You still need to ensure you are practising your weekly spellings, times tables and Century Tech. You must ensure that you are reading and signing your planner weekly.

History:

Topic: Ancient Greece

Create a table of research based on the Ancient Greek Gods. You will need to find out:

- What are their names
- What were they the God of?
- Are they related to any of the other Gods?
- Any interesting's facts that you like.



Science:

Topic: Living things and their habitats.

Find a flower real or one online and draw ta details sketch of its parts.

Can you name all the reproductive parts such as:

- Petals
- Style
- Stigma
- Filaments
- Anther
- Ovaries



English:

Topic: Stories from other cultures.

Our fictional text this half term is Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo. Children should have a go at preparing a television interview with Michael's parents. Children should create a range of 10 questions for Michael's parents, making sure that you have an idea of the responses you will give. Children should try and use figurative language in their interview, making sure their answers are factual.

Children should be reading their ZPD book and practising their weekly spellings at least 4 or 5 times a week. Please sign the children's planner once you have read with them.

Maths:

Topic: Perimeter and Area.

Pupils will continue to develop their arithmetic skills with weekly task set on Century Tech. These tasks will contain questions based on each weeks leaning objectives. Complete the topic related task on Century Tech and complete the worksheet that will be stuck in your home-work book.

Geography:

Topic: Comparing settlements.

Children create a fact file for Sweden, Peru and the UK. The fact file must include the following information:

- key physical and human characteristics, countries and major cities.
- comparisons between the countries.
- locate the countries on a world map, concentrating on their environmental regions.



R.E.:

Topic: Holy Books

To create a fact file on another holy books that is not the Bible or the Verdas such as:

- The Torah
- The Qu'ran
- The Guru Granth Sahib

D.T.:

Topic: Seasonal Foods

Create an information leaflet on 3 of your favourite foods. For each food you should research and answer the following questions:

- is it a fruit, vegetable, grain, meat or dairy product?
- What type of climate do they grow best?
- What country do they grow in?
- Do they grow in the UK?
- What season do they grow?

Computing:

Topic: Inputing data

Complete a table of shopping items. Can you present your findings in Excel or create a table at home. The table should have clear heading and easily represent the information to the reader. It should show:

- the item
- the cost of one
- the quantity bought
- the overall cost for the item.

P.S.H.E.:

Topic: Family Life

Create a poster on healthy relationships. It should include:

- what types of relationships are there?
- What makes a healthy relationship?
- What makes a negative relationship?
- Who are the family and friends that have a positive affect on your life?

P.E.:

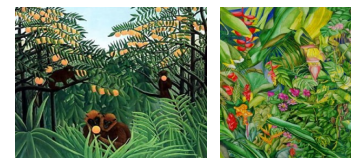
Topic: Athletics / Swimming:

In P.E. this half term children are focusing on Athletics. Children should have a go at creating their own athletics course. They should take into account careful consideration for a range of needs, e.g. those fasting through Ramadan, so some stations may need to be adapted. Children should complete the stations from their athletic course and record their scores and compare their scores with their peers in class or family members. Swimming will take place at Half Fish HQ on a Wednesday morning.

Art:

Topic: Flora and Fauna:

Create your own piece of flora and fauna art work in the style of Henri Rousseau and one in the style of Ruth Daniels. Children then write a comparison of each piece of artwork, outlining the similarities and differences.



Music:

Topic: Dancing in the street.

Children can create their own lyrics for their own 'Dancing in the street strong.'

Children should think about the:

- tempo
- pitch
- structure

Children can have a go at performing their own song.

French:

Topic: Transport.

Children can create their own transport timetable. Children should include:

- The transport
- The changes
- Include the correct verb forms.
