

Price increase of Breakfast Club & School Meals from September 2024

We would like to advise that from Tuesday 3rd September 2024 there will be a price increase to the cost of breakfast club and school meals. The current price for breakfast club is £1 per day, this will rise to £1.50 per day, to ensure all children attending continue to receive a healthy breakfast and the best supervision before they start the school day. School meals will also increase from £2.35 to £2.40 per day for a nutritionally balanced two-course meal. It should be noted that a school meal still provides excellent value for money. We continue to work closely with LCC who provide the catering service and have taken their advice with the price increase but still remained lower than the recommended charge per day. They continue to offer an exciting and varied range of meals which are both healthy and nutritious. All of the menus are developed in line with the nutritional standards which meets the government food standards and gives value for money.

There will be no impact for KS1 children who receive the Universal Infant Free School meal offer, or our students in receipt of Free School Meals.

For parents who pay for school meals we would like to remind you that it may be worth making an application for Free School Meals https://www.blackburn.gov.uk/schools-and-education/school-meals

I ask for your understanding with these price increases and fully appreciate that times are tough. If you have any questions please don't hesitate to ask them and I'll do my best to answer them.

Please be reassured that, we will continue to assess the meals to ensure that their quality is maintained.



School Uniform Reminder

PE KIT

Children to come to school in PE kit on their PE/Games days

- Navy blue shorts
- White round neck t-shirt with logo
- Black pumps (not trainers)
- Professional For health and safety reasons headscarves are not allowed in PE or games. If required a sports/athletics hijab may be brought in to wear during the session
- For health and safety reasons earrings, Taweez, head scarves, watches, bracelets etc are to be removed by the child before the session. If earrings cannot be removed by the child they must be covered over before arriving at school.
- 2 Long hair is to be tied back safely.

GAMES

- Children to come to school in PE kit on their PE/Games days
- Appropriate dress is required for outdoor games and swimming
- Trainers may be worn for outdoor games.
- Children must not wear football boots inside the building
- Some KS2 children will require a swimming costume, a towel and a swimming cap.
- For health and safety reasons headscarves are not allowed in PE or games. If required a sports/athletics hijab may be brought in to wear during the session
- For health and safety reasons earrings, Taweez, head scarves, watches, bracelets etc are to be removed by the child before the session. If earrings cannot be removed by the child they must be covered over before arriving at school.
