

Year 6 Homework Autumn Term 2024

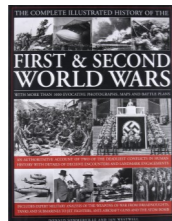
This overview gives you some ideas of how to keep on learning at home. I have set you some challenges to complete for all of the subjects we look at in class, or the challenges might revisit prior learning.

History

Topic: *The First and Second World War*



- Research a soldier from Blackburn that fought in World War 1 or 2. Create a non-chronological report on their life.
- Research the life of children during WW2. How was life for them living in a city? Compare your life with theirs. How do they differ?

Science

Topic: *Biology- Evolution and Inheritance*

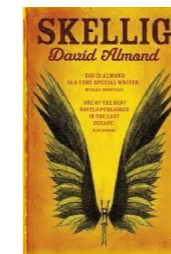
- Create a poster about one variation in one type of pet e.g. dog, cat, horse, guinea pig, rabbit etc.
- Research the work of Mary Anning and her contribution towards the understanding of evolution.



English

Topic: *Novel as a Theme/ Diary Entries*

- Write a recount of your journey through a building. Use your sense to help describe what you see.
- The book focus on themes like trust and friendship. Who do you trust and how does this make your friendship strong?

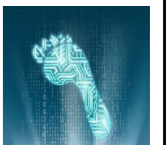
Topic: *Alan Turing: Programming*
