YEAR GROUP in the services

Forest Pre-School & Nursery

This week the children have read the story 'The Runaway Chapati. They have compared the similarities and differences between this story and the Gingerbread Man. They have also answered 'why' questions about the story. The children have made some fantastic artwork this week! They have make collage gingerbread people, painted fox faces and worked on their cutting and sticking skills.

Action

Please can all parents send in photos of their child as a baby or celebrating family events. This can be via the Family App or a paper copy. It would be great for all of the children to be able to discuss their own experiences with their peers.

Reception

This week we have continued with Little Red Riding Hood during our literacy sessions. The children have been learning how to sequence a story, have acted out the story pretending to be each character and even sang a song about it. We have continued with learning all about number bonds to 5 and will be extending this to 10 over the coming weeks. You may have noticed your children come home with a bandage on their arm or leg, this is because we had a special visitor, Nurse Angela. She came to speak all about her job as a nurse. The children thoroughly enjoyed the session and some children got to listen to their heartbeats with a doppler and some chose to role play and be bandaged up! I am sure they have told you all about it.

Action

"We attend the discovery area every Monday and Wednesday afternoon. If children do not have their own wellies or wetsuits then we offer what is available in school. If your child does not wish to wear the school wellies or if there isn't enough then they will wear their school shoes. It can be very muddy so if you want to ensure they stay clean then please send in appropriate footwear for these sessions. Thank you to those parents who are supporting their children with reading at home. Please keep this up."

Year 1

"This week, we have been authors, writing our own innovated stories based on the book 'The Tiger who came to tea'. Ask your child to retell their story to you. We have been blown away with the children this week. In Science, we have been learning about the weather and they have created their own weather forecast. Action

Year 2

This week in science we have learnt about seed dispersal and watched a balloon filled with paper pop to represent this. The children have also had a go at writing their own African Folktale. We have had lots of zebras without stripes or elephants with tangled trunks!
